Hodges, No. 15-586, "of the same effect" as the 14th Amendment, which provides for "equal protection under the law," and the 5th Amendment, which bars the federal government from taking property without due process of law. This was the standard, five-justice majority opinion written by Justice Kennedy. It was joined by the other four justices on the Supreme Court – Chief Justice Roberts and Justices Scalia, Thomas and Alito. How did these justices come to this conclusion about "law of the land"? If the history of the U.S. Constitution is well-known, they would probably say it had its origins in the views of the Founding Fathers. It had "its origins in the views of the Founding Fathers," with "its origin in the great run of the history of freedom," and that it was "the fruition of the decisions and experience of the people of the United States, who, under the command of the same constitution, destroyed chattel slavery and the slave trade, and made and enforced their own laws against discrimination on account of race." The assumption is that the Constitution was "a charter of negative liberties"; it was designed to protect our inalienable rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.
